Thanks to the last wishes of the late Luxembourg ceramist Antoinette Lentz, students of the University of Luxembourg will get new housing in Limpertsberg.

Antoinette Lentz, who was the daughter of painter Corneille Lentz, created her foundation in 2015 so that after her death, her property not only could be made available to the students, but also to host artistic endeavours. For the latter purpose, a renovated workshop on the property will also be available to accommodate artists. The new property will be able to accommodate up to 7 students, according to a Fondation de Luxembourg spokesperson.

The Fondation de Luxembourg, created by the Luxembourg state and Oeuvre Nationale de Secours Grand-Duchesse Charlotte, promotes philanthropy by private indivuals and business. It was founded in 2008.
